A quick reminder that the second tax installment will be due on April 17, 2023.

APPLICATION FOR PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

A quick reminder that before carrying out renovation, expansion or construction work, whether for your home, your garage, an agricultural building or a shed, the installation of a swimming pool, a silo, for a well or a septic system you must always obtain a permit beforehand. Plan to apply for your permits in advance!

Please note that the inspector has thirty (30) days to issue a permit or certificate of authorization. Work carried out without a permit may not comply with the standards and regulations in force. Anyone who undertakes work without the necessary permits or authorizations can be given a ticket or a fine, and even demolition could be ordered.

WARNING – URGENT PAYMENT telephone fraud

The Sûreté du Québec wishes to warn you against telephone calls where a so-saying policeman, investigator, peace officer or government official (revenue,immigration), informs you that due to unpaid taxes or fines, a warrant arrest has been issued against you. Other threats, such as prosecution or deportation, may also be mentioned in order to scare you and demand urgent payment and immediate. Your interlocutor (who can speak English or French) could ask, for example:

- to transfer a sum of money to him (by transfer, by check, etc.);
- locate a cryptocurrency counter (e.g. Instacoin) in order to proceed with the purchase of a virtual currency for transfer to a given account;
- to buy prepaid cards (e.g. Google Play) and communicate the codes on the back of the card.

The fraudster will try to maintain constant pressure on you, even going as far as you accompany you on the phone throughout your payment process. Your call could also come from a so-called "fraud agent" investigating a attempted fraud on your credit card. The call may begin with a request for confirmation of your identity and banking information. In some cases, the fraudster will ask you to make a transfer to a specific account to "protect your money".

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM PHONE FRAUD

HANG UP. Don't give in to pressure or panic. These calls (automated or not) are fraudulent. The police (or government officials) do not communicate with citizens with the objective of extracting financial information or money from them (eg. accept payments by prepaid cards or virtual currency as refund). A DOUBT? Find the official phone number of the organization that contacted you, call him and check the validity of the request or threat addressed to you. Born never assume that the phone number on your caller ID is correct. Fraudsters have use software or applications to deceive their victims.

Here are the payment methods available to pay your taxes:

- You can pay from your bank account (CIBC, BMO or Desjardins) with the bill payment option with your (10 digit) registration number which is on your tax bill, please choose ELGIN, MUNICIPALITY OF, TAX as the supplier/payee.
- You can send a check to the Town Hall: 933, 2nd Concession Elgin, QC J0S 2E0
- You can come to the office to pay cash or by check, if necessary, there is a slot in the middle of the door to deposit your payment.
